Here you will find one of Europe's largest and best-preserved medieval city centers; a stroll around Old Town is a must for the first-time visitor. ### *Travelling to Stockholm*

Stockholm has four international airports, all easily accessible from Stockholm Central Station, the largest one being Arlanda. The City Conference Center, where the Symposium is held, is located within walking distance of buses and airport shuttles.

## *Winner 2010*

*The 2010 Stockholm Prize in Criminology will be awarded to Professor David L. Weisburd for a series of experiments showing that intensified policing at high crime “hot spots” actually prevents crime and does not merely push crime around the corner.*

Weisburd has been elected by his peers as President of the Academy of Experimental Criminology, as Co-Chair of the Campbell Collaboration Crime and Justice Group, and as a Fellow of the American Society of Criminology. His research encompasses a wide range of criminological topics, from the causes of Jewish settler violence in Israel to the punishment of white-collar crime in the US.

The Prize will be presented to Professor Weisburd in a ceremony at the City Hall in Stockholm on June 15.

## The Venue

The 2010 Stockholm Criminology Symposium has moved to a new location in the heart of Stockholm.

The three day long conference will be filled with the latest findings from the field of crime policy and will be held at the City Conference Center in a building dating back to 1890. You will be within walking distance of our conference hotels and also of buses and airport shuttles.



## The Symposium Dinner and Prize Award Ceremony

The gala dinner and award ceremony for the Stockholm Prize in Criminology will be held on Tuesday June 15 at Stockholm City Hall. All participants at the Symposium are invited. The cost for attending is included in the conference fee. City Hall is a

Stockholm landmark dating back to the 1920s. The dinner is held in the Golden Hall, which is covered with millions of pieces of glass and gold mosaic, a perfect backdrop for this memorable event.
